75 Years of Saving Lives

Dear Friend,

2019 marked **Wayside Waifs' 75th anniversary** of serving homeless animals. Thank you for being part of that success. It couldn't have happened without you by the animals' sides.

In 1944, Wayside was started by Fenby Webster after she and a small group of animal lovers saw the community needed a better option for helping homeless animals. While we unveiled a new mission statement in 2019, **Partnering pets and people for the bond of their lives**, the same spirit of the organization that Fenby started 75 years ago remains strong and carries on.

The anniversary was a perfect time to begin working toward the future.

The Building Dreams and Transforming Lives Campaign started in August. We broke ground on the \$8.5 million construction project that will add 20,000 square feet to the current campus. The project includes an Education & Training Center for large event hosting, dog training classes, youth education programming, and staff offices; along with a Canine Behavior Center, the second of its kind in the nation, that will exclusively serve shy and fearful as well as high-energy/arousal shelter dogs to transform their behavior.

I couldn't be happier to share that **5,690** animals were adopted into loving forever homes. It was wonderful to see these homeless animals form a bond with their humans when meeting at Wayside.

Wayside's two annual events were extremely successful. In May, Fur Ball: Woof 66 raised a record-breaking \$1.5 million dollars. In September, Strutt With Your Mutt had more than 1,500 people and dogs participate!

It's taken a village to make the past 75 years a success – volunteers, donors, and staff. Because everyone came together, hundreds of thousands of animals' lives have been saved! You have played a vital role in Wayside's journey.




Tomato and The Jones Family
